Graduate Student Enrollment

Graduate students must enrolled in at least4 credits in a given semester beeligible for most financial aid, including federal loans. For MPA students, this equates to at least 2 courses per semester, as ach course invorth 3 credits.

Summerenrollment does not ffect part-time/full-time students tatus However, students should be aware that summer courses are offered in three sessions: Session 1, lasting the first half; Session 2, lasting the second half; and Session 3, lasting the full Summer semester.

Academic Calendar
